## TAX RELIEF MEASURES PROPOSED PROJECTS There are tax relief measures that can reduce the impact of the bond for Minnesota residents. 4.44 **Regular Residential Property Tax Refund** Classroom Annual Refund for Eligible Households Addition A homeowner with a household income of up to \$135,410 is eligible for a property tax refund of up to \$3,310. A renter with a household income of up to \$73,270 is eligible for a property tax refund of up to \$2,570. **Special Residential Property Tax Refund** If you are a homeowner, you may be **eligible for** a special property tax refund. This refund has no income limit and the maximum refund is \$1,000. You may qualify if your net property tax increased by more than 12% between 2022 and 2023, and the increase is at least \$100. Secure **Ag2School Building Bond Tax Credit** Main The School Building Bond Agricultural Tax Credit Entrance (Ag2School) is a 70% tax break on the cost of existing, proposed, and future construction bond issues automatically applied to your agricultural property bill. The bill has strong HIGH SCHOO bi-partisan support.
